Unlocking the power of civil society

Heythrop is part of W.London Citizens: a co-operative venture of the Chaplaincy and the Heythrop Students' Union

NEWS from W.London Citizens:

West London CitySafe: Member institutions across West London have begun to take responsibility for their local streets with a neighbourhood walks in Pimlico, Hanwell, Southall, Ladbroke Grove, and Hammersmith Broadway in the last few weeks. People of all ages and backgrounds have been coming together to meet local traders and establish better relationships in our local areas. This is part of London Citizens' response to the riots of August, to ensure civil society takes responsibility for the safety of the city. The next six months will see a series of walks building towards the launch of many CitySafe zones on June 9th 2012, to mark the start of the 100 days of peace during the Olympic Games.

Taizé is an international ecumenical community of prayer and fellowship, situated near Cluny and Citeaux in southern France. Soon after the end of World War II, the community was founded, devoted to prayer & reconciliation, open to all denominations. Taizé prayer, using meditative chants, is more & more popular; we're looking at ways of doing it here.

Fr.Peter Wilson to celebrate next week's College Eucharist.

The senior Roman Catholic Chaplain to the universities in the RC Diocese of Westminster, Fr.Peter Wilson, has agreed to come to Heythrop to celebrate our Mass next Thursday, January 19th. A native of Cape Town in South Africa, Peter was received into the Catholic Church in 1996 and ordained by Cardinal Basil Hume OSB in 1997. He was appointed to the student chaplaincy, based at Newman House, in 2002 after serving in parish and missionary ministry in the diocese.

Newman House in Gower St., Bloomsbury is the central RC chaplaincy for students & staff in the universities north of the Thames. The chaplains work closely with all the other university ministries, of all faiths and denominations, in the city. Fr.Dave Stewart SJ of the Heythrop Chaplaincy Team is a frequent celebrant at Sunday Eucharist at Newman House.
