Local News: a response to last week's item.

Last week, we reprinted a story from ICN about a French company, Veolia, which lost a bid for a £485million contract in West London, after pressure from campaigners protesting against the company's alleged complicity in human rights abuses in Jerusalem & on the West Bank.

Brian Hoffmann asks to make this response; I'm happy to print it, in a spirit of fairness and of open & constructive dialogue:

Dear Fr Dave,

I was rather surprised to see the article on Veolia in the Newsletter. This appears to be an unveiled, one sided attack on Israeli policy in Jerusalem and the West Bank with no balancing comment whatsoever. The writer of the article seems to have bought into the campaigners' unsubstantiated allegation concerning 'Veolia's direct complicity in grave breaches of international and human rights law in Jerusalem and the West Bank' without actually saying what these breaches are. Why is it that whenever we talk of human rights in the West Bank they are always Palestinian rights - do the Israelis have no such rights?

It is worth noting that according to a former policy planning official in the region, the tempo of Palestinian construction in the West Bank is "more than 10 times greater than that approved by the Israeli government for Jewish settlers."

Vague speculation is no substitute for accurate and valid comment. I realise that this is an emotive issue where people have defined stand-points but if such articles are going to be published then at least there ought to be some balance rather than seemingly accepting the usual anti-Israeli diatribe that we see all too often in parts of the media.

### Hymns for the celebration of Mass today

**Entrance:** Antiphon: Behold, Our Lord will come with power, to enlighten the eyes of his servants, alleluia. (Candles are lit while the antiphon is sung);

**Processional Antiphon:** 174, Nunc Dimittis (verses sung by Schola)

**Alleluia:** Chant; **Sanctus:** 505; **Agnus Dei:** 509; **Communion:** 741, Word of God come down to earth; When to the Temple Mary went, (Joannes Eccard, 1553–1611);

**Final:** 160, Of the Father's love begotten (vv. 1,2,5,6)

### Liturgy of the Word

**1st Reading: Malachi 3:1-4;** "... Who will be able to resist the day of his coming?"

**Psalms(23):** Response, Who is the king of glory? He, the Lord, he is the king of glory.

**2nd Reading: Hebrews 2:14-18;** "... because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

**Gospel: Luke 2:22-32:** "... my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see . . ."

It has been a tradition at Heythrop to stand rather than kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer. Please **feel free to stand or kneel** according to your personal sensitivity.

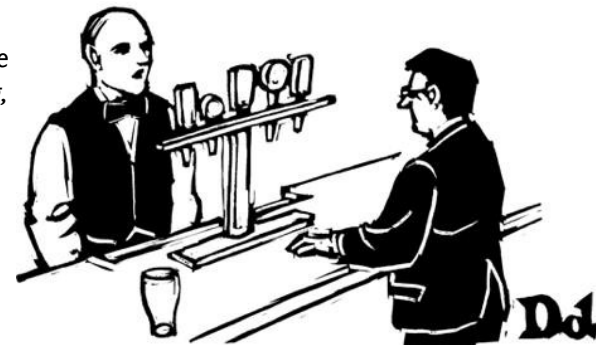
### CHAPLAINCY DROP-IN
