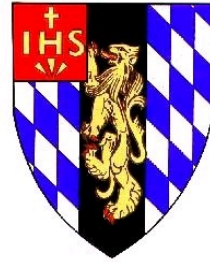

Please **feel free to stand or kneel** according to your personal sensitivity.

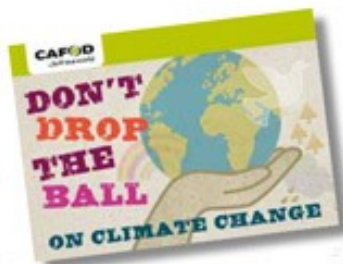
