Please see the availability schedules, posted outside each Chaplaincy Office (Chaplaincy North & Chaplaincy South!)

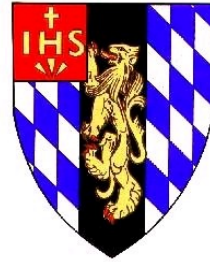
Ignatian Prayer for Generosity

Diocese of Westminster—Patronal Feast St Edward the Confessor, King (1003-66)

King of England from 1042, St Edward was famed for his piety, almsgiving and the building of Westminster Abbey. He died on 5th January 1066 and the resulting Norman and Saxon claims to the succession were fought out on the battlefield of Hastings. Canonised in 1161, St Edward's incorrupt body was translated to a new shrine on 13th



October 1163 (the origin of his present feast day). His cult flourished in the Middle Ages and he was considered one of the patrons of England. Pope Benedict XVI prayed before his shrine on 17th September 2010, alongside the Archbishop of Canterbury, and called St Edward 'a model of Christian witness and an example of that true grandeur to which the Lord summons his disciples'.
