Please see the availability schedules, posted outside each Chaplaincy Office (Chaplaincy North & Chaplaincy South!)

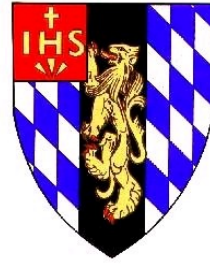
Ignatian Prayer for Generosity

Jesuit Refugee Service — JRS

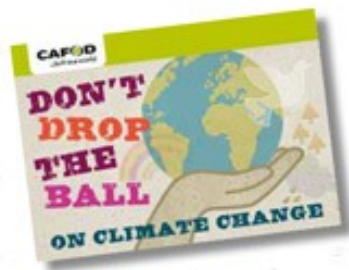
